- Dedicated Volunteers: 43+ compassionate individuals who donate an estimated total of 3,828 volunteer hours per year.
- Trained Professionals: Experienced leaders who guide and support our participants.
- Generous Donors: Community supporters who help us provide this vital service.

Every Monday from 10 AM - 2 PM, we gather in classrooms 5/6 for a day of:

- Arts and crafts
- Music and dance
- Sports and games


COLEMAN OAKS THRIFT STORE & COFFEE SHOP

WILDWOOD SCHOOLS CONNECT MINISTRY

Do you enjoy working with kids and want to serve your community? Are you looking for a flexible volunteer opportunity that fits your schedule? The Wildwood Schools Connect Ministry at Lake Deaton UMC is a community partnership with Wildwood Elementary and Intermediate Schools. We provide volunteers and resources to support programs that enrich the lives of students and staff. Join us on this rewarding journey!

Wildwood Elementary After School Art Club: We offer this program weekly following the calendar school year. These classes are on TUESDAYS from 2:30 TO 4 PM. You can choose the dates that you are available, you don't have to be artistic, just love sharing your time with the kids. We select fun, easy and educational projects for the kids to make. You will be on board after receiving clearance approval from the County School Board. The time flies and the energy abounds; it is such a joy to see the kids express their creativity. The After School Art Club will have a display at the Sumter County Fair in early March as well as an "Art Display Open House" of their club artwork on Saturday, April 26th from 10 AM to 1 PM in the school lunchroom. Please come and see what they have created.

Wildwood Elementary Production of "Frozen: This fun Musical Production by the 3rd graders will be performed during the winter of 2025. (date to be determined). The rehearsals will be in late August. You don't have to know music or have a beautiful voice, just offer your time and encouragement throughout the process.

Wildwood Intermediate School "Snack Shack": This is a positive behavior reward program that takes place every Tuesday during lunch. The students are able to redeem snacks with Wildcat Cash Coupons given to them by teachers and staff for positive behavior during school. We provide these snacks by shopping for them from a preferred list. A once a month shopping trip is usually sufficient and then we deliver them to the school. You can turn in your receipt for reimbursement or donate the items. This is a great Service Project for Small Groups to take on.

EXCITING UPDATE ON THE COLEMAN OAKS THRIFT STORE & COFFEE SHOP!

Praise God the construction is going very well and the interior work will begin in preparation for our early May opening! Thank you for your prayers and support through our "Invest in the Future" program and those who have made contributions.

So why have we opened our "INVESTMENT" opportunity again? Our new goal is \$350,000! While we reached our initial construction goal, we would like to reduce our financial obligation to the land owners who hold the property mortgage for us and provide a cash flow cushion until we are able to open in May. We still owe \$275,000 and are paying 8% interest. If our members invest, we will be saving Lake Deaton \$12,000/year in interest.

SEEDS OF HOPE CONCERT

Lake Deaton will again host a free concert to support the 2025 Seeds of Hope Food Drive. Enjoy lively and toe-tapping music from the 19-piece Villages Swing Band, under the direction of Lew Buckley. The Swing Band will play songs from the swing era, as well as hits from the 1950s and 1960s.

Seeds of Hope is a food fund and awareness-raising committee of the Wildwood Soup Kitchen and Wildwood Food Pantry. It's sole purpose is to assist both ministries in feeding and helping the community. It is staffed solely by Volunteers so all monies go directly to either buy food or keep the facilities operating.

Food is cooked at the Soup Kitchen where meals are served to those who can come or delivered to shut-ins. Snack packs are created for children for nourishment during out of school times. Food insecure families in Sumter County come to the Food Pantry to pickup much needed food on a bi-weekly basis. Both the Wildwood Soup Kitchen and the Food Pantry rely on the generosity of individuals, churches and donations to feed the hungry.


